


Figure 1.1: FrostWire opening/main window/User Interface

Main Window

The opening/main window/user interface, is the window that appears when you open the FrostWire software.

It consists of the following,

Menu Bar: Located at the top, it contains four menu tabs: File, View, Tools, and Help.




Figure 1.2: Menu bar (highlighted in yellow)

Management Ribbon: Positioned just below the menu bar.

It includes,

- Search Panel and Search Icon: Used for entering keywords and filters to find specific files.
- **Transfers Icon**: Helps you monitor ongoing transfers (See "File Transfer Administration" on page 23).
- Library Icon: Used for viewing and managing downloaded files and media.
- Audio Playback Controls: Allows you to control the playback of audio files (See "Playing Media Files" on page 14).

Status Bar: Located at the bottom.

It displays status indicators such as,

- Connection Quality Indicator: Shows your connection quality.
- Firewall Indicator: Displays your firewall status.
- Bandwidth Indicator: Indicates your bandwidth consumption.

This chapter delves into the process of finding and downloading files using FrostWire. Discover various search methods, including basic and advanced searches, and learn how to exclude specific keywords from your search. Explore the essentials of starting, monitoring, and managing downloads, as well as pausing, resuming, and handling failed downloads.

Locating Files

In this part, we will look at some of the basic and complex search methods available in FrostWire.

Basic Search

A simple search will help you discover your files.

To search for files in FrostWire,

- 1. In the Management ribbon, ensure that the "**Search**" tab is chosen (See "Main Window" on page 4).
- 2. Go to the search panel and input keywords to do a basic search. FrostWire will begin receiving results in real time as soon as you input your search term.
- 3. FrostWire will show relevant files depending on their file classifications (such as music files, video files, picture files, documents, programs, and torrent files), making it simple to select the appropriate file.

Advanced Search

Using advanced search options, you may narrow down your search results.

To use advanced search,

- 1. Select '**Options**' from the corresponding drop-down list on the "**Tools**" tab from Menu bar. You may also do this by clicking the "**Settings**" icon at the bottom right corner within the Status bar. A window named "**Options**" appears.
- 2. Select the 'Searching' tab from "Options" window to fine-tune your searches.

You may tell FrostWire which search engines to utilize for your specific file from this window.




Figure 2.1: 'Searching' tab in Options window for Advanced search.

Excluding Key Terms from Search

You may also exclude search results containing particular key terms.

To remove certain keywords from your search results,

- 1. Click the **Settings** icon in the status bar. This brings up the **Options** window.
- 2. Choose Filters from the Options window.
- 3. Add the specific keywords in the relevant **add** section to filter out those keywords.

By doing this, you can filter out the search results having a specific key word.




Figure 2.2: Options for excluding different keywords from the Search.

Downloading Files

Learn how to start and manage downloads in FrostWire.

Beginning Downloads

These are the basic steps to begin downloading your desired file.

To begin the download process,

- 1. Double-click on a file in the search results. The file will begin downloading, and its progress will be displayed in the transfer area.
- 2. You can prioritize or halt the download if necessary.

TIP: Keep in mind that the number of sources/seeds for the file you wish to download should always be checked. It will be shown beside the file. The more seeds your file has, the faster it downloads.

Tracking Download Progress

You can keep track of the download process in real time.

To track the status of an ongoing download,

- 1. Navigate to the **Transfers** tab on the management ribbon.
- 2. All active transfers are included in the **Transfers** section. You may monitor the status of numerous downloads at the same time.
- 3. Each download will display the download speed, percentage of completion, and time left.

TIP: Downloads that have been completed appear in the library for quick access.

Pausing and Resuming Downloads

When you have limited bandwidth or wish to prioritize other tasks, pausing downloads might be handy. Resuming downloads allows you to restart interrupted transfers.

Action	Steps
To pause an ongoing download	Right-click on it and select Pause download. The currently running download will be Paused.
To resume a Paused download	right-click on it and select Resume download. This will continue the download process from where it was interrupted.

Table 2.1: Pausing and Resuming Downloads.

Dealing with Failed Downloads

If a download fails for whatever reason, you can retry it or just remove the unsuccessful download and try again from a new source.

To manage unsuccessful downloads,

- 1. Right-click on the failed download and select **Retry transfer** to retry downloading, or pick **Cancel download** to terminate the download.
- 2. If the download fails repeatedly, try an alternative source or check your Internet connection.

NOTE: Retry transfer allows you to restart downloads that have failed.

TIP: Removing unsuccessful downloads makes room in the queue for new files.

Obtaining Downloaded Files

You may access your downloaded media via the management ribbon's **Library** tab (See "Main Window" on page 4).

Obtaining files from the Library

To view downloaded media from library,

- 1. Navigate to the **Library** tab on the Management ribbon (See "Main Window" on page 4). This opens the library section. FrostWire automatically categorizes all downloaded files on your computer based on the file types.
- 2. To obtain a certain file, pick the corresponding file category (music, video, pictures, document, programs, torrent) from the left side panel, or simply put the file name into the section's search panel.

TIP: You may also browse the folder containing the most recent saves by selecting "Default save folder" from the left side panel in the library section.




Figure 3.1: File categories for quickly accessing files in the Library.

Playing Media Files

FrostWire supports smooth media playback with its own in-built media player.

Playing Media in FrostWire

You can enjoy music using FrostWire's built-in media player.

To play media with FrostWire's built-in media player,

- 1. Double-click on a file in the library or playlist.
- 2. FrostWire's built-in media player will begin playing the file.

The playback options allow you to pause, play, adjust volume, and skip to the desired sections of your media files.

Changing Playback Preferences

You may customize playing options like as volume, repeat, shuffle, and equalizer settings under the media player settings, which is situated on the right side of the control ribbon.

Adjusting the settings improves your media playback experience by tailoring it to your tastes. You may fine-tune audio settings to achieve the best possible sound quality.

Selecting an External Media Player

You may also play your media files using an external media player.

To use an external media player,

- 1. Click the settings button in the status bar. This brings up the **options** menu.
- 2. In the **option** window, pick **Player** to specify the default player.

NOTE: Setting an external media player allows you to play media from your favorite player. When you play media using an external player, FrostWire will immediately launch the selected player.

Customization Options

You can customize FrostWire settings according to your preferences.

General Software Settings

This is where you can access all the main settings of FrostWire.

To access FrostWire Settings,

- 1. Click on the **settings** icon in the status bar. This opens the **Options** window (See "Main Window" on page 4).
- 2. In **Options** window you can customize various options related to torrent, library, media player, search results, network settings, and also other advanced features.

NOTE: Adjusting general settings allows you to personalize the software for a smoother user experience. You can choose whether FrostWire starts on system boot and how it shuts down.

Customization in View

FrostWire interface may be customized to your preference.

To see FrostWire's customizable settings,

- 1. Go to **View** in the menu bar. This opens a drop-down menu with choices such as icon size, icon text, font size increase/decrease, and language preferences.
- 2. Choose the option you wish to modify.

NOTE: Personalizing FrostWire allows you to create a more visually appealing interface. FrostWire's look may be tailored to your preferences and aesthetic sensibility.




Figure 4.1: Customization options in FrostWire

Configuring Network Options

You can Optimize FrostWire's network settings from the Advanced configuration options for optimal performance.

Network Connection Settings

You can access the various Network connection settings offered by FrostWire from the Advanced configuration options.

To access Network settings,

- 1. Select the **settings** icon from the status bar. This opens the **Options** window.
- 2. Select **Advanced** tab from the left panel in the **Options** window. This will display all the advanced configuration options.
- 3. Select **Network Interface** from this list to see all the advanced options for network settings.

Here you can configure different network options.

NOTE: Optimizing network settings ensures FrostWire operates efficiently for file sharing and media streaming.

Advanced Configuration Options

You can access Advanced options for customizing more advanced features offered by FrostWire.

To access advanced options,

- 1. Select the settings icon from the status bar. This opens the **Options** window.
- 2. Select **Advanced** tab from the left panel in the **Options** window. This will display all the advanced configuration options.

NOTE: Advanced configurations provide additional control over FrostWire's behavior and performance.

WARNING: Use these settings carefully only if you are familiar with their implications.

Proxy Configuration

You can configure proxy settings in FrostWire if you use one.

To access Proxy settings,

- 1. Click on the **settings** symbol in the status bar. This brings up the **Options** menu.
- 2. In the **Options** window, select **Advanced** from the left side. This brings up all of the advanced setup choices.
- 3. On the left panel, select **Proxy** from the **Advanced** tab to display the Proxy options available in FrostWire.

NOTE: Configuring proxy¹ settings allows FrostWire to interact with proxy networks flawlessly. To ensure appropriate operation, make sure the proxy settings match your network configuration.

^{1.} A proxy connection refers to an intermediary server that operates between a user's device and the Internet. It acts as a buffer, managing requests and responses on the user's behalf thereby enhancing privacy, security, and overall Online functionality.

File Sharing

You can share the files you downloaded in FrostWire with others.

Initiating File Transfer: Method 1

You can send the links or URL of your downloads to your friends through any social media application.

To share files,

- 1. Right-click on a file in your library and choose **Send to a friend.** This opens a confirmation box.
- 2. After confirming, a new window opens, which has options for copying the link or the URL of your file.
- 3. You can now copy the link or URL of your folder and send it to your friend through any social media platform.

NOTE: Your friend will need FrostWire software installed for successful file sharing.




Figure 5.1: Share window in FrostWire.

Initiating File Transfer: Method 2

FrostWire may also be used to exchange files on your PC.

To share a random file,

- 1. Navigate to the File menu in the Menu bar.
- 2. Choose **Send file or folder** from the list.
- 3. This opens the browser window, where you may select the file to transmit.

4. Click **Select** once you've chosen the appropriate file. This opens the share window, where you may copy the file's link or URL.

TIP: You may use this way to transfer any file you want over FrostWire, and not simply the ones you got through FrostWire.

File Transfer Administration

To ensure a seamless experience, monitor and regulate ongoing file transfers.

Monitoring active File Transfers

In the transfer panel, you can see a list of all active file transfers as well as their progress.

NOTE: The transfer panel updates the progress of your file transfers in real time. Keep an eye on ongoing transfers to ensure they are completed successfully.

Pausing and Resuming Transfers

You can pause and resume the ongoing transfers as you like.

To pause and resume ongoing transfers,

- 1. Right-click on a transfer and select **Pause**. Pausing transfers helps you to better manage network resources or prioritize other tasks.
- Right-click on a stopped transfer and select **Resume**. Resuming transfers allows you to continue interrupted transfers without having to restart them from the beginning.

Finishing and Verifying Successful Transfers

When a transfer is finished, you will receive a **Transfer Completed**¹ signal. If required, you can inspect the size and content of the transmitted files to ensure their integrity.

NOTE: Confirming successful transfers guarantees that you have acquired all of the needed files.

TIP: Checking file integrity helps to avoid data corruption or incomplete transfers.

^{1.} A pop-up window will alert you when the transfer is complete.

Glossary

This glossary defines and explains major terminology used in the FrostWire User Guide. If you come across any strange words when using FrostWire, go to this area.

A

Advanced Settings

FrostWire's behavior may be fine-tuned using configuration options and preferences aimed for expert users.



Bandwidth

A network or Internet connection's maximum data transfer rate.

BitTorrent Protocol

A protocol used in a peer-to-peer network for file sharing through torrents.

Bug

A bug is a software fault, defect, or malfunction that creates unexpected behavior or outcomes.

Buffer: A buffer is a temporary storage region for media files that allows for seamless playing.



Community Forums

Online venues where users may participate in conversations and seek help from other FrostWire users.

Cross-Platform

FrostWire is cross-platform compatible with a variety of operating systems and devices.

Custom Playlists

FrostWire users' personalized groupings of media files.



Debugging

The process of finding and correcting problems or faults in software.

Device Compatibility

FrostWire's ability to interact with many types of devices and operating systems is referred to as device compatibility.

Download Panel

FrostWire's Download Panel displays both current and completed file downloads.

Download Queue

A collection of files that are waiting to be downloaded in a certain order of priority.

Download Speed

The speed at which files are downloaded from the Internet or from other FrostWire users.

Е

Error Code

A numerical code that indicates a specific error or issue within the software.

External Devices

Smartphones, tablets, and portable media players that can be connected to FrostWire for file transfer.

External Media Player

A separate media player software installed on a device, different from FrostWire's built-in media player.

F

File Integrity

The state of being complete and uncorrupted.

File Sharing

The process of sharing media files with other users within the FrostWire network.

File Sharing Requests

Requests from other FrostWire users to share specific files from your library.

FrostWire

A free and open-source software that enables file sharing and media streaming among users.



Glossary

A section in the User Guide that provides definitions and explanations of key terms used in FrostWire.

GUI

Graphical User Interface; the visual layout of FrostWire, including menus, buttons, and panels.

Integrity

The state of a file being complete and unaltered without any corruption or data loss.

Library

The collection of downloaded and shared media files within the FrostWire application.

Leechers

Users who are downloading files from others in a torrent network but are not actively sharing the complete file with others.

Linux

An open-source operating system based on the Linux kernel, widely used on computers and servers.

M

Managing Preferences

Customizing FrostWire settings according to personal preferences and requirements.

Media

Content such as music, videos, or documents that can be downloaded, streamed, or shared within FrostWire.

Media Content

Audio, video, images, or other multimedia files are available for sharing and streaming within FrostWire.

Media Player Settings

Customizable options and configurations within the media player for playback control.

Media Streaming

The process of playing audio or video files over a network without downloading them first.

Monitor

Observe or track the progress or status of tasks, downloads, or transfers in FrostWire.

N

Network

A group of devices or computers connected together to share resources and communicate with each other.

Network Type

The classification of a network, such as public or private, based on its accessibility and security.

P

Peer

An individual user within a P2P network who shares files with other peers.

Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Network

A decentralized network where participants directly share files and resources with one another without the need for a central server.

Playback

The act of playing media files within FrostWire's built-in media player or external media player.

Playback Controls

The buttons or options used to control media playback, such as play, pause, volume, and skip.

Playlist

A curated list of media files arranged in a specific order for playback.

Port Forwarding

The process of configuring a network router to allow incoming data packets from the internet to be forwarded to a specific device within the local network.

Proxy

An intermediary server that acts as a gateway between a user and the Internet to enhance security and privacy.



Queue Management

The process of organizing and controlling the order of files to be downloaded or transferred.

S

Seeder

Users who have a complete copy of a file and are actively sharing it with others in a torrent network.

Settings

The section in FrostWire where users can configure and customize various options and preferences.

Sharing Preferences

Customizable settings that control the extent of file sharing with other FrostWire users.

Smartphone

A mobile device that combines the functionalities of a phone with those of a computer, such as browsing the Internet, accessing email, and running applications.

Sorting

Arranging files or items in a particular order based on specific attributes or criteria.

Startup Behavior

Configuring how FrostWire behaves when starting up or launching on a device.

Storage Space

The amount of available space on a device's storage drive for storing media files.

Streaming

Playing media files in real-time without downloading them first.

Sync

Synchronize, in the context of transferring media files to external devices.

Syncing

The process of matching and updating data between two devices to ensure consistency.

Support Team

The team responsible for providing assistance and help to FrostWire users.



Task

A specific action or operation performed within FrostWire, such as downloading a file or creating a playlist.

Theme

The visual appearance or style of FrostWire, including color schemes, icons, and overall design.

Torrent

A small file that contains information about the location of media files and allows for efficient downloading through a P2P network.

Transfer Panel

The section of FrostWire that displays ongoing and completed file transfers.

Troubleshooting

The process of identifying and resolving issues or problems within FrostWire or its functionalities.



Update

A new release or version of FrostWire that includes enhancements, bug fixes, and new features.

User Experience (UX):

The total experience a user enjoys when interacting with FrostWire, including usability and satisfaction.

User Interface (UI)

FrostWire's graphic arrangement or visual representation that allows users to interact with the software.

User Preferences

Settings and choices that users can adjust based on their preferences.

User Guide

A user guide is a detailed booklet or handbook that provides instructions and information on how to use a software program or product.



Video

Moving visual content that can be played within FrostWire.

Volume

The loudness or intensity of audio playback.



Warning

A notification or message indicating a potential issue, risk, or cautionary note.

Windows

A popular operating system developed by Microsoft used on computers and laptops.

Wireless Connection

A network connection established without the use of physical cables, often using Wi-Fi technology.
